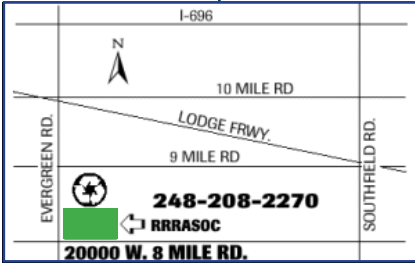


FREE DROP-OFF FOR RECYCLABLE ITEMS AT TWO CONVENIENT LOCATIONS

In Southfield

The drop-off area is open 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

The following items may be deposited, unsorted, into on-site receptacles:



- Magazines
- Newspapers
- Plastic Containers (both narrow-neck and wide-neck containers; #1, #2, #4 - #7)
- Bulky #2 Plastics (like cat litter buckets and kids' molded furniture)
- Glass Bottles and Jars
- Catalogs, Junk Mail, & Phonebooks
- Household Metals (including pans and small scrap metal)
- Garden Plastics
- Paper Drink Cartons
- Boxboard
- Cardboard

Separate receptacles also are available for:

Cardboard • Office Paper • Plastic Bags • Styrofoam • Clothing (Planet Aid)

Old electronics, also called e-waste, can be dropped off for recycling. Computers, monitors, laptops, printers, scanners, cables, computer mice, keyboards, televisions, DVD players, VCRs, game consoles, stereos, radios, microwave ovens, telephones, cell phones, MP3 players, PDAs, and small household appliances are accepted. Special household hazardous waste and e-waste recycling events are held throughout the year. Visit www.rrrasoc.org to find out more.
