NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Resource Recovery and Recycling Authority of Southwest Oakland County (RRRASOC) shall hold a regularly scheduled Board of Directors meeting on Thursday, January 28, 2021, at 9:30 am, via Zoom Virtual Meeting.

This meeting will be held electronically as authorized by the State of Michigan to mitigate the spread of COVID-19, protect the public health, and provide essential protections to vulnerable Michiganders.

Re: Simple Recycling Agreement

#### **Action Requested**

Approve the agreement between RRRASOC and Simple Recycling.

#### Overview

While the Simple Recycling clothing and household goods curbside collection program is temporarily suspended due to the impacts of COVID 19 (see attached), it is anticipated that the program will resume during 2021.

Despite two temporary suspensions of service, the program continued to be popular in 2020, with more than 215,000 pounds of items being collected for reuse and recycling. In addition to curbside service, Simple Recycling also provided collection services at several of the HHW events.

The agreement for services between RRRASOC and Simple Recycling expired in December. The attached document renews the agreement through December 31, 2023.

#### Exhibit A

Contractor's Fee – Contractor's Fee – Contractor fee shall be \$0.00 per pound of gross receipts of soft recyclables. Contractor agrees to a review of the Fee every 6 months. Upon the Contractors assessment in which the market conditions have returned to prepandemic performance levels, Contractor agrees the fee to paid to RRRASOC shall return to \$0.01/lb beginning the month following the next scheduled review.

RRRASOC agrees to notify residents of program through existing communications channels a minimum of 6 times in each calendar year at no cost to contractor.

Examples of communication channels include: Social media, email, newsletters, publications, school events etc.

As we continue to fight the global COVID-19 pandemic as a business, nation and work, the reuse and recycling of textiles has been impacted dramatically in many ways.

Due to the daily record-breaking rise COVID-19 cases in the State of Michigan and beyond, Simple Recycling has made the decision that it is in the best interest of our employees and communities to temporarily suspend curbside textile collection until further notice. The effective suspension date is November 23, 2020.

We fully intend on brining this program back to your community in the future and estimate that Spring 2021 is when we'll hopefully see health and market conditions improve. In the meantime, we are willing to work with RRRASOC on possible alternative collection option for your residents.

We would like to thank the residents who made an effort to increase the diversion of textile waste with our program. We are wishing you and your loved ones continued health and well-being.

#### **Action Requested**

#### Overview

Attached for your review and acceptance is the 2020 Annual Report. The report contains a variety of metrics depicting aggregate program performance in 2020. Metrics for individual communities have been distributed individually.

We believe the report demonstrates that RRRASOC and its Member Communities navigated the COVID 19 pandemic and continued to deliver cost-effective, high performing programs and services through intergovernmental cooperation, service contracting, and public private partnerships.

Highlights of the report include the following:

- Total solid waste expenditures in the RRRASOC communities continue to be below the regional average and median;
- The annual audit by Plante & Moran showed that RRRASOC improved its financial position;
- RRRASOC secured grant funding and leveraged partnerships to facilitate continued program improvement;
- The combined recycling rate of the RRRASOC communities remained more than double the overall Michigan rate and above the national average;
- Total recycling pounds per household continued to perform above the nationally recognized "high performer" threshold;
- The household hazardous waste program, the Simple Recycling program, and the recycling drop-off centers continued to be very popular.



The events of 2020 demonstrated the institutional resiliency of RRRASOC, its Member Communities, and the contractors that provide services to the residents of our communities. Deemed part of the country's critical infrastructure and essential services, most solid waste and recycling services continued largely unabated.


#### Notable activities in 2020 included:

- Along with its MRF operating partner, Republic Services, RRRASOC navigated the challenges posed by the COVID 19 pandemic, as well as the difficult commodity and labor markets, with the RRRASOC MRF remaining the highest volume processing facility in Michigan;
- RRRASOC began working with IRIS Waste Diversion Specialists and The Recycling Partnership to improve material quality and processing safety by reducing recycling contamination, using a \$150,000 Recycling Quality Improvement grant from the Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy (EGLE);
- A Recycling Infrastructure grant of nearly \$24,000 was awarded by EGLE, funding security cameras for the Novi Drop Off Center to address illicit dumping and material contamination;
- The Michigan Department of Agriculture awarded a \$20,000 Clean Sweep grant to RRRASOC to facilitate the collection of pesticides within our communities;
- The annual audit by Plante & Moran of the RRRASOC Financial Report for FY 2019 –
  2020 showed that RRRASOC conducted its financial affairs in accordance with
  generally accepted accounting principles and that the Authority improved its
  financial position;
- The completion of the FY 2020 2021 Solid Waste Expenditure Benchmark Study demonstrated the continued cost effectiveness of the programs in the RRRASOC communities.




More than 38,000 tons of recyclable and reusable material, yard waste, and household hazardous waste items were collected and diverted from local landfills through the RRRASOC curbside collection, drop-off, and event-based programs.

The combined recycling rate of the RRRASOC communities was 36.25%, which is twice Michigan's recycling rate and 13% above the national average.




Overall, the RRRASOC communities collected more than 434 pounds per household through their curbside cart/bin collection programs, exceeding the national "High Performer" benchmark, in addition to the national and Michigan averages.



Lifecycle analysis shows that recapturing those resources for value-added economic activity also yielded significant environmental benefits, including the following:

- Conserved nearly 172 billon Btu, the equivalent of the annual energy consumption of more than 1,700 households;
- Preserved nearly 129,000 trees;
- Reduced waterborne pollution emissions by 72 tons;
- Reduced airborne pollution emissions by nearly 19,300 metric tons of carbon equivalent.



RRRASOC's MRF operating partner, Republic Services, operated the MRF at full capacity, running two production shifts per day, often six days per week, as the MRF continued to serve as the cornerstone for the recycling in the RRRASOC communities and much of southeast Michigan.

As part of the critical supply chain, Republic Services successfully navigated the health and safety issues related to COVID 19, with no lost operational time.

Overall, the facility processed nearly 74,000 tons of material during the year, which is a four percent increase from the previous year. Nearly 23% was material from the nearly 74,000 RRRASOC area homes and the RRRASOC drop-off centers. Our communities accounted for nearly 17,000 tons of paper, glass, plastic, and metal that was processed at the MRF and shipped throughout the U.S. and abroad, providing valuable feedstock for manufacturers.











Despite cancelling all four of the spring collection events due to COVID 19, RRRASOC's Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) collection program had great participation in 2020. More than 7,700 residents participated in the program to take advantage of the opportunity to recycle and properly dispose of the hazardous material found in their homes, making it the third highest year of participation in program history.

Attendance records were set at events in Wixom and Southfield and the use of the contractor's site for drop off set a new record. In addition, three extra HHW events and three extra document shredding events were held to make up for the missed opportunities in the spring.

Nearly 520,000 pounds of material were collected in 2020, which is 4% more than 2019. The material was comprised of the following:

- Used electronic equipment = 54.5%;
- Automotive fluids = 11.0%;
- Herbicides, pesticides, and other toxic products = 9.5%;
- Oil-based paint = 7.2%;
- Toxic products = 6.9%;
- Lead acid and dry cell batteries = 6.7%;
- The remaining 4.2% fell into 14 other categories of hazardous materials.

ERG Environmental Services, a local hazardous waste company, handled the material. Disposal and recycling costs through ERG continued to be among the lowest in southeast Michigan. All material was handled in accordance with state and federal laws.










RRRASOC's recycling drop-off centers continued to be a popular recycling option for many throughout the region. Last year, 822 tons were brought to the sites.

The drop-off center in Novi accounted for 628 tons of recycling, while the Southfield location contributed another 194 tons.

Using Recycling Quality Improvement grant (RQI) funds for evaluation and education, the RRRASOC team was able to reduce contamination at the Novi location by nearly 50%.




The Simple Recycling program remained robust despite the impact of COVID 19, which required the temporary suspension of the program twice during the year. Designed to complement charitable giving by our homeowners, the program offers an opportunity to ensure that household goods that might otherwise be landfilled are integrated back into the value chain. During the year, more than 215,000 pounds were collected for reuse and recycling.



RRRASOC continued to use a multi-platform approach to community outreach and homeowner education. Last year's efforts complemented the communication programs of our individual communities with the following:

- Nearly 175,000 grant-funded, direct mail educational postcards;
- Nearly 82,000 material searches using our online Recycling Directory;
- Downloads of the Recycling Directory mobile application increased by 21%;
- Subscribers to our monthy electronic newsletter increased by 29%;
- 806 new resident packets were distributed;
- The RRRASOC website was updated and redesigned.

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
