School Year Earth Friendly Habits

Reduce, Reuse, Recycle!



Reduce the amount of waste your household produces during the school year by taking stock of what you already own and reusing what you have. Do you have a notebook that's only partially filled or a backpack that just needs a little bit of cleaning? By reusing these items, you'll not only be making an earth-friendly decision, but you'll be saving on school supplies as well.

Lower Emissions

Zero Emissions Day is right around the corner. If you live near the school, try biking or walking to save on gas and reduce your CO2 emissions. It's healthier, plus it relieves congestion on public transportation and on the roads! If you live far from the school and have friends or classmates who live nearby, consider arranging a carpool so that only one vehicle is used.

If you're one who waits in the drop-off or pick-up line at your child's school, turn the engine off while you wait. Car idling is a major contributor to air pollution and can become costly after some time.



Packing a Waste-Free Lunch



Instead of relying on single-use disposable containers and bags, use reusable, long-lasting alternatives for utensils, food containers, beverages, and even straws. Instead of purchasing pre-packaged snacks, buy in bulk quantities to store in large containers at home and in reusable snack pouches when you're away.

Another way to achieve a waste-free lunch is through portion control. U.S. schools waste about 530,000 tons of food per year, but only packing what is needed and safely storing unfinished food is a great way to help tackle this issue.

HHW Drop-Off at ERG Environmental Services

If you have HHW that you'd like to properly dispose of between collection events, you're in luck! Drop off your HHW without a fee at ERG Environmental Services during the following hours:

Mon, Wed, Fri: 9:00 AM - 5:00 PM

Tue, Thur: 9:00 AM - 7:00 PM

HHW pickup from your home is also available for a fee of \$135 per stop plus \$0.75 per pound of material collected. This fee is paid directly by the resident to ERG
